## QUEEN ELIZABETH II.

Is the constitutional monarch of 16 sovereign states. She was born in 1926 in London. Her full name is Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Windsor. Her coronation was on 2nd June, 1953.

## SIR WINTSTON CHURCHIL

Was a British politician who was the prime minister of the UK. He was born in 1874 in

Woodstock. Churchil also served in the navy and during First World War he served as the First Lord of the Admiralty. ## MARTIN LUTHER KING JR.

Was a leader in the African-American Civil Rights Movement. MLK was, and still is, a real symbol of freedom. He was born in 1929 in Georgia. He studied for a priest and he became a priest in Montgomery, Alabama. Soon became one of the leaders of the Afro-American community.

From 1955 to 1956 was MLK elected president of a organization which was responsible for the successful Montgomery Bus Boycott.

He is the most important speaker of the Afro-American community. His most famous speech during a demonstration in Washington D.C. is known as I have a dream. His final speech I've Been to the Mountaintop in 1968 in Memphis are among his most famous utterances and the next day after he was shot.
