New Year's Day - January $1^{\text {st }}$

St Valentine's Day - February $14^{\text {th }}=$ lovers day (people send Valentine cards - not signed + exchange gifts)

All Fools' Day - April ${ }^{\text {st }}$ people play jokes and tricks

Easter - after $1^{\text {st }}$ full moon in spring=> marks the crucifixion and resurection of Christ - Good Friday(not cross buns), Easter Sunday, Easter Monday

May Day - May $1^{\text {st }}$ a celebration of the coming of spring
Mother's Day - $2^{\text {nd }}$ Sunday in May - it honours all mothers
